AGENCY MISSION:

The fundamental mission of the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners is to help protect the health and safety of the citizens of the State of Texas by ensuring that our drinking water, air, and medical gases are free from contaminants so that we may live and work in the safe conditions that properly designed and installed plumbing systems are meant to provide. Our primary influence in fulfilling this mission is ensuring that individuals entrusted with a license issued by the Board and endowed with the inherent credibility it provides, are competent and exhibit the requisite fitness to perform plumbing work in this state. Another cornerstone in fulfilling the Board's mission is through community outreach and public education, ensuring that the public is aware of the crucial role plumbing plays in guaranteeing sanitation and health, and the sometimes unheralded role of the licensed plumbing professionals who safeguard the public's health. The Board steadfastly believes that an informed public will demand the reliability, accountability and sound judgment of a licensed plumbing professional, ensuring that plumbing services are only provided by such proven professionals, and not left to unqualified and sometimes unscrupulous individuals who might undermine the Board's mission through unlicensed plumbing work.

Community outreach and public education also serves the dual purpose of promoting the plumbing profession as a rewarding career option; an important task after years of flat growth in the workforce while the population of Texas has been, and is expected to continue to grow. The Board also takes seriously its statutory charge to investigate consumer complaints alleging threats to the public's health and safety and to take enforcement and disciplinary action against persons who have violated the Plumbing License Law; thus preventing potentially dangerous unlicensed plumbing work and ensuring that licensed plumbers continue to exhibit fitness and uphold the high standards of licensure in the field. ADMINISTRATOR'S STATEMENT:

The Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners (TSBPE) has always generated significantly more revenues than it is given to expend in its annual budget and to carry out its statutory duties. TSBPE does not receive any funds from any other state or federal source. All fees for examinations; initial and renewal of licenses, duplicate licenses, endorsements, registrations; and administrative penalties collected are deposited directly into General Revenue Fund 0001. On average, TSBPE has collected more than \$1.9 million each year over and above its total appropriated and unappropriated expenditures. Through fair and consistent regulation of the plumbing industry, and by examining, licensing and registering plumbing professionals, the Board ensures that qualified individuals follow clear standards while protecting the citizens' health and safety. While the lowering and adjusting of fees for some licenses and endorsements will most certainly make for a more economically friendly process, the Board estimates a reduction of approximately \$1 million in its total collections each year for FY 2021 and FY 2022. Other barriers such as the relaxing of rules and expedited processing of examinations and renewal applications will put the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners at the top of many lists for soon-to-be plumbers.

Advancements in technology continue to make the TSBPE more accessible to consumers and those regulated by the agency. Because more consumers have access to information technology such as email and internet, consumers of plumbing related services are more informed regarding the regulations governing plumbing work and the responsibilities of the Board. Consumers and plumbers have heightened their expectations of how the Board should perform its duties. Advancements in technology have led them to expect more rapid responses from the agency to address their needs, including licensing, examination, complaint processing and requests for information. Additionally, consumers have increased their expectations of the Board to enforce the regulations governing plumbing work.

The Board investigates consumer complaints and employs experienced licensed plumbers on staff as its Investigators dedicated to investigating those complaints. The Board has statutory authority to impose administrative penalties, and to refer matters to the Attorney General for injunctive relief in court if needed. The Board's administrative rules impose a code of conduct on its licensees and registrants. The Board can use licensure to hold plumbers accountable for bad acts, including fines, license suspension and revocation, and the ability to seek restitution on behalf of consumers.

Consumers expect the TSBPE to be responsive to their complaints and ensure that it licenses and registers only qualified individuals to install and inspect plumbing. In addition, consumers can be confident in those licensed by the Board with the implementation of a new required fingerprint program. There are currently 2,036 individuals that have submitted their fingerprints since the program officially began in December 2019. Those who are compliant with the requirements expect the agency to take action against those who violate the Plumbing License Law and Board Rules.

The agency's overall customer base continues to expand and demonstrates the vital role the agency plays to the State and its citizens. Through review of the agency's rules and procedures, the TSBPE has made significant advances in its ability to quickly process examination applications and license and register those wishing to enter the plumbing industry. Plumbers truly are "essential" to both the public's health and safety. In order to safeguard the health and safety of the citizens of Texas, plumbing professionals must be properly qualified and exhibit requisite qualities as demonstrated by and through examination and licensure by the Board.

The Board employs experienced licensed plumbers as Examiners. These experienced licensed plumbers ensure that examination testing procedures are applicable to the most current products and applications.

By working with both public and private partnerships while offering examinations in Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston, Lubbock, Corpus Christi and the Rio Grande Valley areas, the burden of travel to the Austin area is reduced for many examinees. In addition, TSBPE is working with a 3rd party vendor and will soon offer computer-based testing in over 40 locations around the State through a secure online system.

Examinations increased by 39% from Fiscal Year 2018 to Fiscal Year 2019, utilizing the remote locations listed above. Staff anticipates that with the introduction of computer-based testing, the rate of examination will sharply increase in Fiscal Years 2021 and 2022. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a fast start in examinations for Fiscal Year 2020 was slowed significantly. Examinations were postponed beginning with the 3rd week of March 2020 and resumed in June with modified processes to safeguard staff and examinees. The Examination Center is uniquely situated to allow for the separation of administrative staff from examinees. In addition, the building allows for easy social distancing when arriving and during check-in for their examination. Strict protocols used during the regular yearly flu season were ramped up to address and prevent the spread of the COVID virus. While TSBPE has expanded its work from home staff, examination staff have worked tirelessly to continue to administer examinations in a safe and efficient manner. Examinations that were postponed in March, April and May have been rescheduled and/or completed. As of the date of this report, the TSBPE currently has 634 examinations scheduled.

Included in this report are Examination Statistics for Fiscal Years 2018 through 2020.

In the wake of hurricane disasters and the present pandemic, the Board can quickly assist the affected community and administer examinations around the State to bring in new qualified workers; and, potentially, to serve as a base of operations for the Board's Enforcement should those services be needed.

During the COVID 19 pandemic the Board developed disaster markers to address the need for licensees and registrants to renew while waiting for their required continuing education classes. Many of the classes typically held in classroom settings were cancelled due to the virus. Working with the education providers, classes were re-imagined using a virtual platform. While there were more students than available classes, staff were able to mark those licensees and registrants that met renewal requirements with the exception of the pending class. The disaster markers were placed where needed and then removed as the individuals were able to obtain their required education. The application allowed staff to assist those in need and to quickly track the need and area of assistance. This development will allow for future disasters as needed. The number of markers placed and assistance provided was more than 3,000 licensees and plumbers as of the date of this report.

The TSBPE is one of seven agencies utilizing the Health Professions Council (HPC) regulatory database VERSA. Through regular collaboration with educated and experienced HPC staff, the agency has established not only a productive relationship to meet needed goals but has also gone above and beyond to meet the expectations of offerings to our licensee population using the online account system. TSBPE maintains an average online user of approximately 87%.

By providing license and disciplinary history on the TSBPE website, the public is able to make educated decisions when selecting a plumber. The consumer can locate a compliant plumber or plumbing company in their area. The Board also continues to operate as a "clearing house" for the ever-growing pool of Master Plumbers serving as a Responsible Master Plumber ("RMP") and operating plumbing companies in this State by storing and verifying certificates of insurance, processing company name changes, and verifying RMP status for political subdivisions such as municipalities, so that they may issue plumbing permits as required by the Plumbing License Law.

The agency website also offers guidance to registrants and plumbers regarding required education and length of training when progressing through the industry ladder. Failure or delay in delivering these key services can delay or prevent economic activity in municipalities and other local governments experiencing rapid development, and would unnecessarily impede economic growth and prosperity for the State overall.

Licensed individuals from other states as well as Veterans having plumbing experience and training have become an integral part of the Board's customer base. In Fiscal Year 2020, the agency examined and issued more than 100 licenses to individuals licensed in other states wishing to perform plumbing in Texas. The total population of individuals coming to Texas from other states is now over 5,000. The agency's Veteran population is currently more than 600 registrants and licensees.

A chart containing the total licensee and registrant population by rank is included in this report.

With the expansion of the agency's Consumer Education and Public Outreach strategy, the agency will increase its availability to provide consumer outreach and public education on the importance of the vital and essential role that licensed plumbing professionals play in safeguarding the public's health and well-being. While doing so the agency can simultaneously serve to recruit bright and eager young minds to carry on the profession, amid an aging workforce in the skilled construction trades, and an aging workforce overall, with the retirement of the baby boomer generation looming. While the current COVID 19 pandemic has temporally depleted opportunities to perform public outreach and consumer education in person, staff will now offer training and demonstrations in a virtual setting until such time as it is safe for public in-person gatherings. Video materials are also being made available from the website.

The agency has also made most of the recommended changes proposed by the Sunset Commission during its review in 2018. Recommendations for changes in the Plumbing License Law will allow for the few remaining items to be completed.

-THREE EXCEPTIONAL ITEMS REQUESTED-

1.) INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ENHANCEMENTS:

The following regulatory database modifications and applications will be developed by Tyler Technologies and maintained by the Health Professions Council (HPC). The TSBPE is one of seven agencies that works with HPC to maintain license data within the Versa Regulation Program. These modifications will streamline the path for renewal of licenses and the maintenance and tracking of required education programs as well as provide up to the minute examination results.

Exam Data Transfer Modification: Develop a new module in the Versa license system to allow the transfer of examination data from a 3rd party vendor to provide almost instantaneous examination results to show within the online license accounts of examinees.

Display of Licensee and Registrant Education History: Display the licensee and registrant education history to provide direction as they progress through the Plumbing Profession and apply to obtain each higher ranking license. This will assist the licensee and Education Providers with obtaining and supplying the correct education to applicants for examination and endorsement.

Continuing Education Date Range Modification: Modify the date range within the Versa Program relating the Plumber's Continuing Education course requirements to

meet updated renewal requirements for Plumber licenses thereby addressing an issue brought to the Board through Sunset Review. The modification will eliminate confusion in obtaining the correct required continuing education course each year by allowing for a standard calendar year rather than an arbitrary 12 month period.

License Renewal Date Standardization Modification: Modify the date range for license endorsement renewals to match the renewal period for the license. In addition, this will also bring into the same renewal period the licenses for plumbing inspectors that also carry a Plumber license and endorsement. This is also based on a recommendation brought forth through the Sunset review process.

Cost for all the Information Technology enhancements is \$15,000 in FY 2022, a one-time expense.

- 2.) REPLACEMENT OF TWO VEHICLES FOR FIELD INVESTIGATORS/REMOTE EXAMINATIONS AND CONSUMER OUTREACH AND EDUCATION: Our second exceptional item is the replacement of two older vehicles (2008 and 2009) utilized by the Board's Field Representative/ Investigators for enforcement of the Plumbing License Law across the state, Consumer Outreach/Education and Remote Examinations. The estimated average accumulated mileage on each vehicle scheduled to be replaced would be 150,000 or more by August 2021. The total additional funding requested for these two replacement vehicles is \$60,000 for FY 2022, a one-time expense.
- 3.) COMPENSATION TO RETAIN AND OBTAIN EXPERIENCED QUALIFIED PERSONNEL: The Board must pay equivalent and/or competitive salaries as currently offered by cities, counties, political subdivisions and private industry. Merit increases are also needed to retain employees who have shown exceptional performance, have met the challenges of increased workloads and whose length of service with the TSBPE has provided the agency and its employees valuable institutional knowledge of the Board's operations, increasing efficiency. As the economy and job market continue to improve from the COVID-19 pandemic, employees with exceptional job performance who have not received a sufficient salary increase may become discouraged and leave the agency or move to another agency for better opportunities. The TSBPE has already lost some experienced and knowledgeable employees due to the Texas economy and the perception of more lucrative employment elsewhere.

 Re-training of new replacement employees is costly and hinders productivity. Cost for this exceptional item is \$25,000 per fiscal year, or \$50.000 for the biennium.

TSBPE Sunset Action History

TSBPE did not ignore the directives of the Sunset Commission in 2002.

- A review and comparison of the 2002 Sunset staff report and the 2018 Sunset staff report reveals only 3 potential "carryover" issues in common:
 - o Industry Staffing Shortages:
 - The 2002 Sunset report concluded: "[TSBPE] was not well positioned to address the shortage of Licensed Plumbers in the State."
 - Although TSBPE reports exam wait times of around 3 months existed in 2002, the 2002 Sunset report did not criticize TSBPE for exam wait times, and did not cite wait times as a source for industry staffing shortages.
 - The 2002 Sunset report recommended coordination with the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC), the agency responsible for promoting recruitment in the industry.
 - In response to the 2002 Sunset review, the 78th Legislature passed SB 282, which added Sections 1301.651 and 1301.652 to the Plumbing License Law, calling for TSBPE to assist TWC in its efforts; but, <u>TWC</u>, not TSBPE, is <u>tasked with addressing industry staffing shortages</u>.
 - The statutory duty of TSBPE is to ensure that licensed, qualified individuals are utilized by industry in the field.
 - Staffing shortages touch each of the construction trades, not just plumbing, and indicates a systemic issue greater than TSBPE's operations.
 - However, TSBPE requested appropriations for a new strategy to promote consumer education and industry recruitment, and directly address industry staffing concerns. This strategy was approved in the 86th Legislative session.
 - o Prioritization of Complaints.
 - The 2002 Sunset report recommended changes in statute for TSBPE to prioritize the investigation of complaints so those complaints with the greatest potential for harm are investigated first.
 - These recommendations led to the current Section 1301.303(e) of the Plumbing License Law.
 - TSBPE immediately adopted a rule (367.15) to implement the statute in 2003. <u>TSBPE did not ignore Sunset's recommendation or the requirements of the statute</u>.

- However, TSBPE agrees with Sunset's conclusion that the rule was not as detailed as it should have been and in need of amendment.
- As addressed below in summarizing TSBPE's actions following the 2018 Sunset review, TSBPE has diligently responded to Sunset and adopted rule amendments to resolve any deficiency.

o Public Disclosure of Disciplinary Actions.

- The 2002 Sunset report recommended that TSBPE "promote consumer awareness about the plumbing profession and the operations of the agency through the Internet and brochures."
- Since 2002, TSBPE has diligently promoted consumer awareness through its website, and the materials it distributes.
- The 2002 report also required the Board to "explore the possibility of developing an online system allowing consumers to check disciplinary orders and sanctions against the Board's licensees."
- In February of 2003, after the 2002 Sunset review, TSBPE began compiling lists of recent disciplinary actions pertaining to contracting for plumbing without the appropriate license, which were then published on TSBPE's website for public viewing and distributed to Continuing Education providers to disclose.
- In April of 2004, TSBPE began compiling and adopting at its Board meetings, a schedule listing and summarizing disciplinary actions taken by the Board, which it would then post to its website for review and for download, along with a copy of the agenda for the meeting.
- In July of 2018, TSBPE began compiling and adopting an additional schedule of disciplinary actions imposed by default and arising from implementation of SB 2065 from the 85th Legislature.
- Following the 2018 Sunset review, TSBPE has diligently responded to Sunset and has begun providing disciplinary history of its licensees online and available to consumers, including the ability to retrieve copies of the documents imposing the disciplinary action instantaneously. Consumers can easily review a licensee they are considering hiring and determine if they have any past disciplinary actions that might impact their decision.

Sunset concluded TSBPE's statute impeded its ability to respond during Hurricane Harvey.

- 2018 Sunset report: "While other agencies were able to leverage reciprocal agreements and temporary license authority [to respond to natural disasters], the lack of [a] similar statute impeded the plumbing board's ability to respond quickly to the disaster recovery efforts after Hurricane Harvey in 2017."
- Changes in statute are necessary to give TSBPE all the tools needed to respond effectively to natural disasters.
- However, TSBPE, with the Governor's approval, immediately responded to those affected by previous and current disasters with the tools available in its statute, including by (i) extending license expiration dates, (ii) waiving license late fees, and (iii) exempting or delaying individuals from continuing education requirements in the affected areas.

TSBPE has met or exceeded Sunset's expectations for agency action:

- Form a working group with TDLR by 02/01/2019 COMPLETED
 - TSBPE and TDLR began meeting monthly and worked closely to improve TSBPE's processes and procedures, regardless of what was occurring during the 86th Legislature.
- Publish disciplinary history online by 05/01/2019 COMPLETED
 - o Beginning 01/15/2019, TSBPE established the online availability with the assistance of HPC to display disciplinary history for its licensees, utilizing and modifying existing resources.
- Adopt rules for risk-based prioritization of complaints by 09/1/2019 -COMPLETED
 - o On 05/15/2019, TSBPE adopted rule changes to carry out this directive.
 - o TSBPE reports the rules are scheduled to be published in the 05/31/2019 edition of the *Texas Register*.
- Adopt rules to better document the use of Informal Settlement Conferences COMPLETED
 - o On 05/15/2019, TSBPE adopted rule changes to carry out this directive.
 - o TSBPE reports the rules are scheduled to be published in the 05/31/2019 edition of the *Texas Register*.

• Review to ensure that written examinations do not favor one plumbing code over the other – **COMPLETED**

- o No revisions were necessary, as TSBPE's examinations have always been code neutral.
- Sunset staff did not actually find that TBSPE's examinations favored one code over another or created a conflict among plumbing codes.

• Adopt rules to eliminate the requirement to have a high school diploma or GED for licensure

- On 05/15/2019, TSBPE adopted rule changes to eliminate the high school diploma requirement for the Journeyman Plumber License.
- o TSBPE reports the rules are scheduled to be published in the 05/31/2019 edition of the *Texas Register*.

• Open 7 testing facilities by 09/01/2019.

- TSBPE regularly conducts examinations in Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston and Lubbock, and the Rio Grande/ Corpus Christi area.
- Since January 2019, TSBPE has conducted approximately 800 examinations at its partnership testing locations outside
 of Austin.
- Since January, 2019, TSBPE has also conducted approximately 200 Saturday examinations at its Austin facility. Testing location availability is currently limited due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Simplify the timeframe for obtaining Continuing Education by 09/01/2019

TSBPE is working to allow the CE compliance year to reset according to the pre-existing 12 month calendar period before implementing the changes directed by Sunset, to avoid disruptions to the program, and ensure a seamless transition for plumbers and CE providers. Rules covering this and several other changes related to continuing education and endorsement renewal dates are in development.

"Take it, Make it."

o On 02/03/2019, a TSBPE rule change became effective allowing examinees to retake only those portions of the exam they failed, increasing examination roster capacity and output.

TSBPE implemented fingerprint-based criminal background checks:

- SB 621 (as amended by the House) would have required TDLR to fully implement fingerprint –based criminal background checks by 09/01/2025 had the TSBPE been moved to TDLR.
- However, on 05/15/2019, TSBPE adopted rule changes to begin conducting fingerprint-based criminal background checks.
 - o TSBPE reports those rules were fully adopted on 05/31/2019 and the process and procedures were implemented in December 2019 beginning with the Tradesman Plumber-Limited Licensee.

TSBPE has worked aggressively to eliminate examination wait times:

• TSBPE has been conducting examinations around the State, and on Saturdays, to eliminate wait times. Included with this report is a breakdown of all examinations performed. As of the date of this report, the current wait time is approximately 3.4 months but will become much lower for the written portion once the full computer tested program is complete.

Streamlined practical exam.

o On 11/01/2018, TSBPE eliminated the practical exam for Tradesman Plumber-Limited licensees taking the Journeyman Plumber exam, since these individuals have already demonstrated their skills when taking the Tradesman Plumber exam.

Streamlined Plumbing Inspector exam.

- On 05/17/2019, TSBPE modified the Plumbing Inspector practical exam to include a new format where the examinee reviews a mock plumbing installation to identify potential violations of code, replacing the review of a scaled model, and eliminating a "bottleneck" in the exam.
- o The new format is more realistic to what an examinee would see in the field.
- The new format expands roster capacity and examination output, and TSBPE reports examination wait times for the Inspector examination will soon be around 30 days.

- SB 621 would allow for a 3rd party to administer examinations.
 - o Sunset Commission Recommendations also called for statutory changes for the 3rd party administration of exams to clarify the authority to do so. However, the Board has moved forward with a 3rd party program and expect to have it fully implemented during 2021.
 - With 3rd party administration, examination output can scale to meet changes in demand and preventing wait times in times of peak demand.
 - The 3rd party administration of exams requires the creation of a digital examination, to be administered in a secure computer lab setting.
 - TSBPE is pursuing digitization of the written exam, to allow for 3rd party administration to be implemented.
 - TSBPE is simultaneously developing new exam material to "refresh" and modernize the exam, and to create a "pool" of exam questions that the digital exam will pull from, to randomize the exam, and increase security.

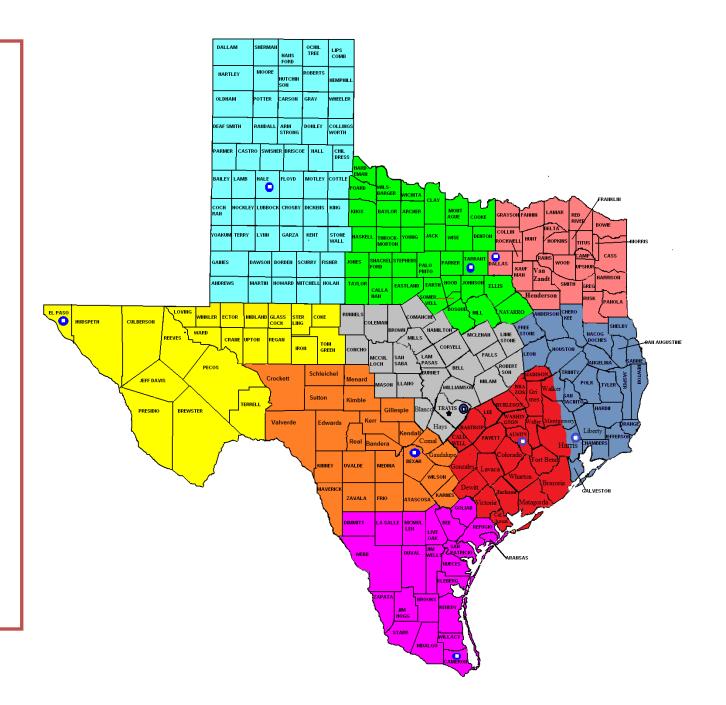

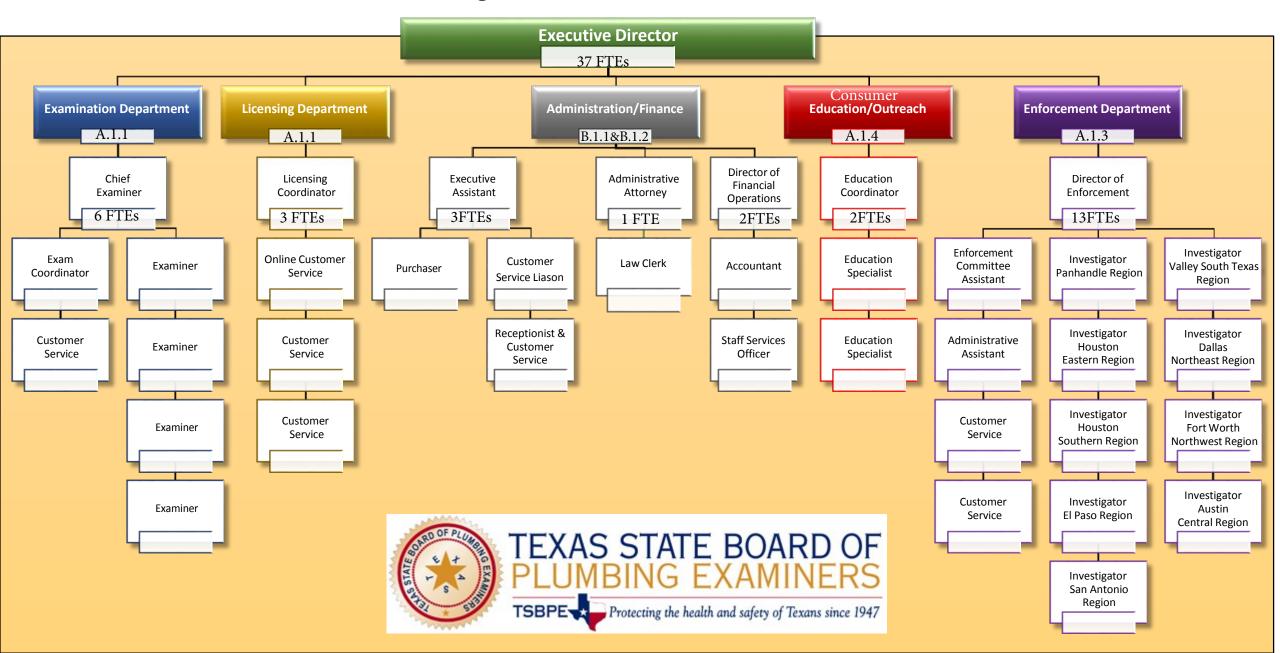

STRATEGY DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION:

One of the Board's duties is to employ Examiners to "examine the fitness and qualifications of a person applying for a license." This begins with application reviews, including applicants with criminal histories and individuals coming from another state or foreign country. Separate examinations are given for the following licenses and/or special endorsements: Journeyman, Master, Tradesman, Medical Gas Piping Installation, Water Supply Protection Specialist, Multipurpose Residential Fire Protection Sprinkler Specialist and Plumbing Inspector. With the exception of the Water Supply Protection Specialist, all exams consist of thorough written and hands-on-practical sessions that ensure licensed plumbers and plumbing inspectors have the qualifications, knowledge, skills, and competencies to do their jobs properly. The life of any plumbing system, large or small, is directly related to the preparation and assembly of the materials that go into the making of that system. It is difficult to detect improper preparation of materials once they are assembled and installed in the plumbing system, until the system fails. The failure of a plumbing system can result in considerable expense to the consumer, fires, explosions, serious health problems or even death. For this reason, the practical portion of a plumbing exam is critical to ensure the applicant can demonstrate their ability to properly prepare and assemble plumbing materials used in plumbing systems. Once a person successfully receives a registration or license, it must be renewed annually by meeting all renewal requirements.

Current growth projections for Texas indicate there will be continued positive growth. As the Texas citizen population increases, so will the demands on the agency and agency staff. The Texas Economic Forecast, prepared by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, conservatively predicts at least a 1.5% annual increase in the Texas resident population each year through 2023, with a strong probability to exceed the forecasted amount. These increases in population will increase the demand for licensed plumbers, plumber's apprentices and plumbing inspectors. This, in turn will increase the demands on the agency, especially in the areas of issuance and renewal of licenses and registrations, examinations, enforcement, complaint investigation and compliance checks. A continued significant increase in the number of licenses and registrations issued and renewed is expected, as well as an increase in complaints that will be filed by Texas citizens.

Enforcement of the Plumbing License Law is critical to the health and safety of the citizens of Texas. This includes taking action against unlicensed individuals illegally engaging in plumbing and licensed individuals who may not be upholding the required standards. Unlicensed plumbing contractors are of particular concern. Due to the importance of the exam process, the Board strives to identify unlicensed activity, taking action against unlicensed individuals practicing in violation of the Plumbing License Law. Enforcement action by the Board can result in the non-renewal, suspension, or revocation of a license, as well as imposition of administrative penalties. The Board also monitors required Continuing Professional Education courses to ensure minimum requirements. The regulation of plumbing installations by qualified plumbers and inspecting of those plumbing systems by qualified plumbing inspectors is critical to the health and safety of the citizens of Texas. Improperly installed plumbing systems can cause injury and death through explosions, fires, hospital medical gas contamination, and noxious fumes. They can also transmit diseases that include typhoid fever, diarrhea, cholera, and amoebic and bacterial dysentery. Improperly installed medical gas systems can deliver contaminated or cross-connected medical gases to hospital patients, causing sickness and death. The public looks to TSBPE to ensure the quality of plumbing work that it receives and also expects the Board to respond to complaints regarding the plumbing industry in a timely and responsible manner.

The Texas Economic Forecast, prepared by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, conservatively predict at least a 1.5% annual increase in the Texas resident population each year through 2023, with a strong probability to exceed the forecasted amount. These increases in population will increase the demand for licensed plumbers, plumber's apprentices and plumbing inspectors. This, in turn will increase the demands on the agency, especially in the areas of issuance and renewal of licenses and registrations, examinations, enforcement, complaint investigation and compliance checks. A continued significant increase in the number of licenses and registrations issued and renewed is expected, as well as an increase in complaints that will be filed by Texas citizens.

B. Assessment of Fiscal Year - Efforts to Meet HUB Procurement Goals

Attainment:

For fiscal year 2018, the Board exceeded four of the five applicable HUB goals (Special Trade, Professional Services, Other Services and Commodities) when compared to its own goals and the Statewide HUB goals. During FY 2018, we paid a small amount of Building Construction to one non-HUB vendor for new electrical wiring services. We were required to use the non-HUB vendor, as they are the designated electrician by the owner of our leased building.

During FY 2019, the Board spent \$3,000 with one vendor that had been a HUB for many years, but sadly lost their HUB status when the woman-owner passed away.

As evidenced by our HUB use percentages, the Board is proudly committed to the goal of awarding contracts and purchases to HUB vendors whenever possible.

The Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners (TSBPE) makes a good faith effort to utilize Historically Underutilized Business (HUBs) through the use of a strong procurement plan. TSBPE's procurement plan requires a regular search of the Centralized Master Bidders List (CMBL) when planning to buy goods and services. TSBPE will purchase from a HUB vendor to the fullest extent possible.
